

PE Sports Funding Summaries for 2015-2016 and 2016-2017

- **In 2016-2017 funding was spent in the following way:**
 - Appointment of a Partnership Sports Co-ordinator: pooling together a proportion of the funding with other local schools, to pay for a joint Sports Co-ordinator. This role aims to provide specialist support and training for school staff, to ensure high quality PE curriculum teaching and coaching in school. In addition, the Sports Co-ordinator organises inter-school competitions; increasing participation and opportunities for children to compete. We have continued to engage with the 'Chance to Shine' cricket program and this has given the staff an opportunity to team teach with a Level 2 cricket coach. Supporting teachers CPD in PE has made us reflect on our own practice, particularly how PE lessons could be outstanding. (£3,700)
 - Providing supply cover to allow the PE Co-ordinator to attend competitions with sports teams and assisting with transport costs when necessary. Also, to allow release time for the PE Co-ordinator to organise sporting events and maintain levels of assessment and monitoring within school. Further to this we are continuing to work towards getting our Upper Junior children to lead manage and officiate sporting activities within the school. These children regularly meet with a designated member of staff for planning, support and training. (£400)
 - Support affiliations to leagues and competitions for a range of sports. For example, the Vale of White Horse Primary Schools Football Association, British Gymnastics Association and the Vale PE and School Sport Partnership. Children benefit from healthy competition and take pride and enjoyment in representing our school. Success in competition has also helped to raise the profile of PE and sport in the school, making more children participate in sporting activities. Over 40% of our KS2 children have represented the school at Inter-school sporting activities. In addition to this over 65% of our children have participated in extracurricular sporting activities such as, hockey, netball, archery, football, rounders, Zumba, dance and tag rugby. (£700)
 - IT software to support PE Planning. (£175)
 - Support the management, development and resourcing of our Sports Leaders initiative. Once children reach year 6, they have the opportunity to become a Sports Leader. Sports Leaders run lunchtime games and activities in the playground. The initiative is designed to: involve children in group games, ensure playtimes are fun and enjoyable, and develop skills in responsibility and leadership. (£2,498)
 - Resource high quality PE and sports equipment and storage to support the improvement of provision for children in school and enabling the school to offer a varied PE curriculum - for example archery, dodge ball, volley ball and rounders specialised equipment. Their skills and interests in different sports is encouraged and developed and a large number of children take up opportunities to continue to develop their skills in after school clubs using the new equipment. (£1,950)
